Printing Information

This document includes two formats for printing.

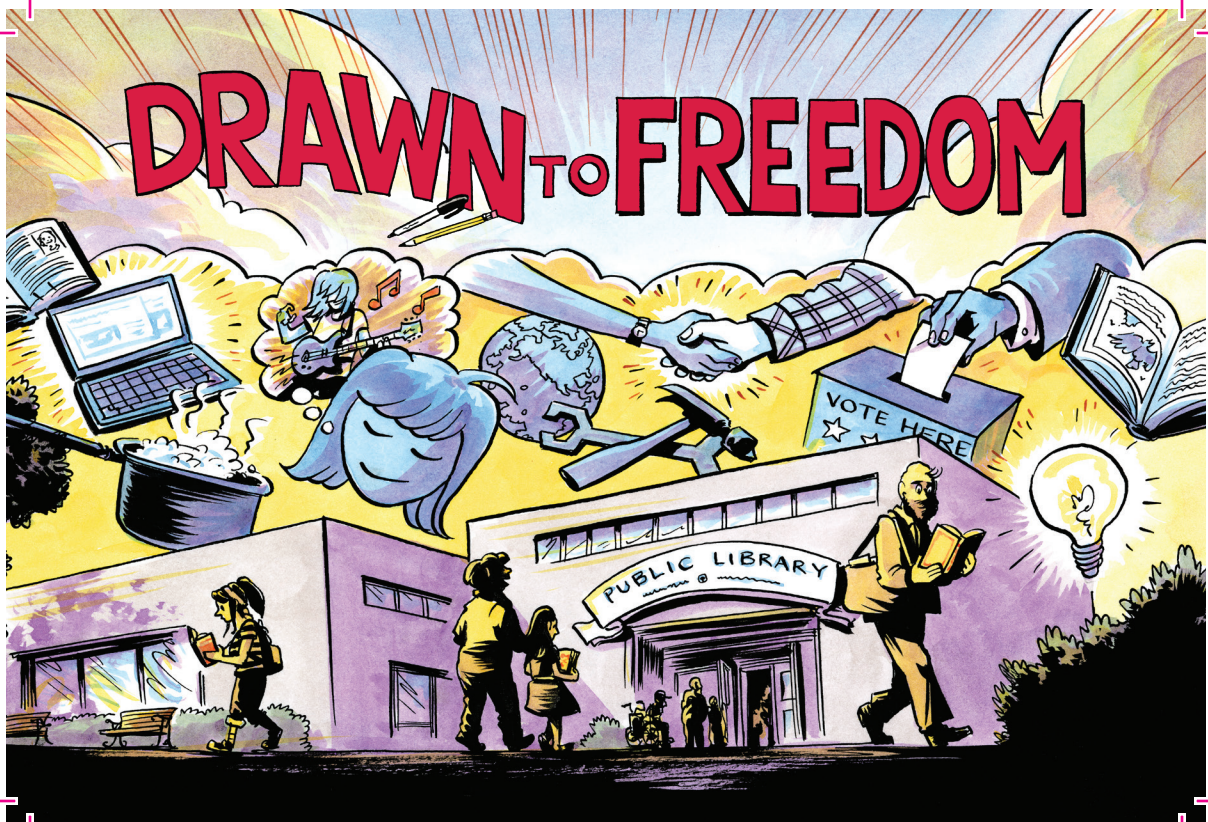
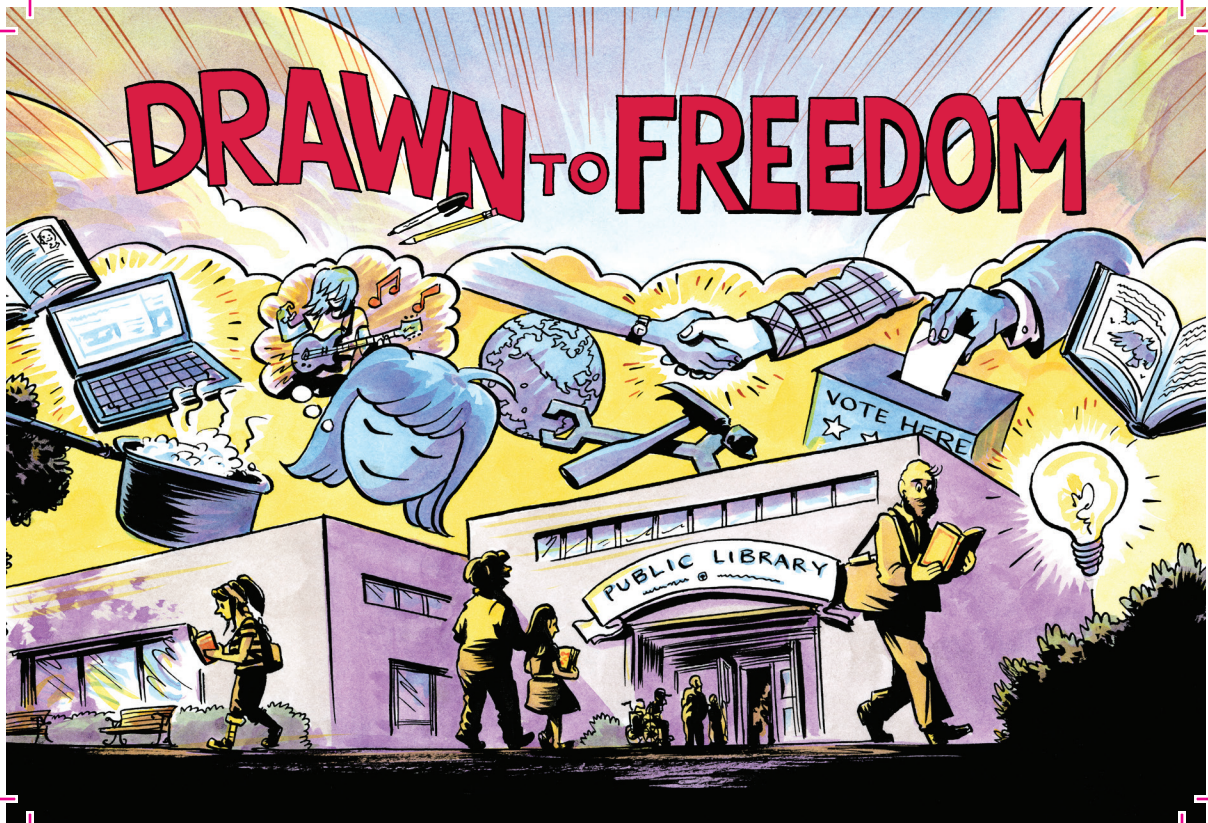
Two postcards:

- Suitable for personal and consumer-grade printers and letter-sized paper.
- Double-sided, full color both sides.
- Recommend cardstock or cover paper.
- Each postcard has 1/8" of extra space (or bleed) on each side of the card. The pink hashmarks indicate where you should cut the cards to a finished size of 4" x 6".

Single postcard:

- Recommended for professional printing.
- Double-sided, full color both sides.
- Recommend cardstock or cover paper.
- The image area is 4.25" x 6.25" with a 1/8" bleed on all sides. Once trimmed, the finished postcard will measure 4" x 6".

Note: A postcard larger than 4.25" x 6" requires letter-rate postage instead of postcard-rate postage, so trim accordingly to avoid additional expense. Postcard thickness should be between 0.007 and 0.016 inches (most readily available cardstocks fall in this range).
